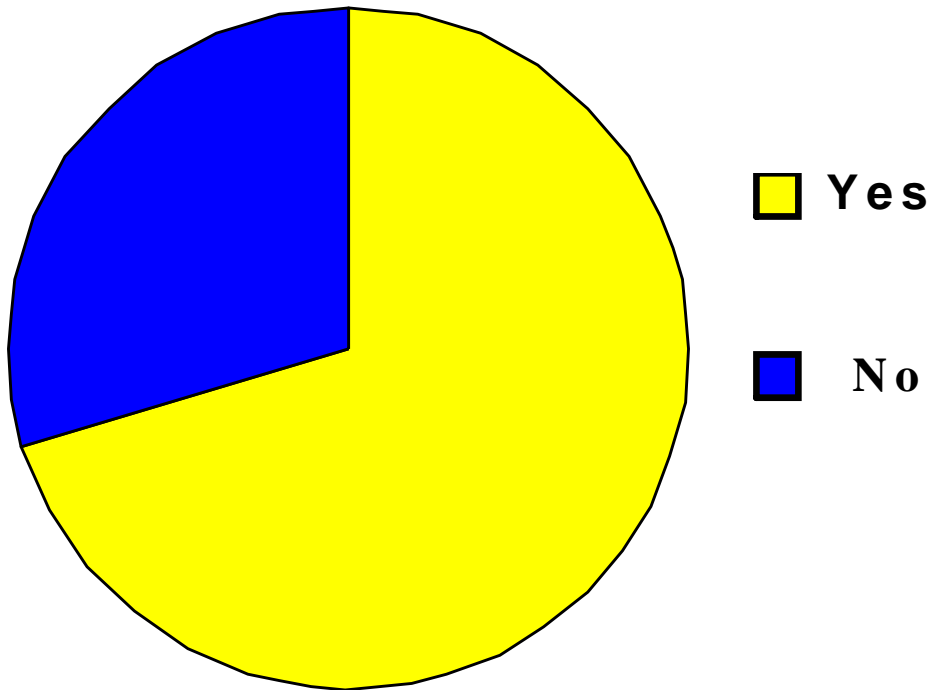


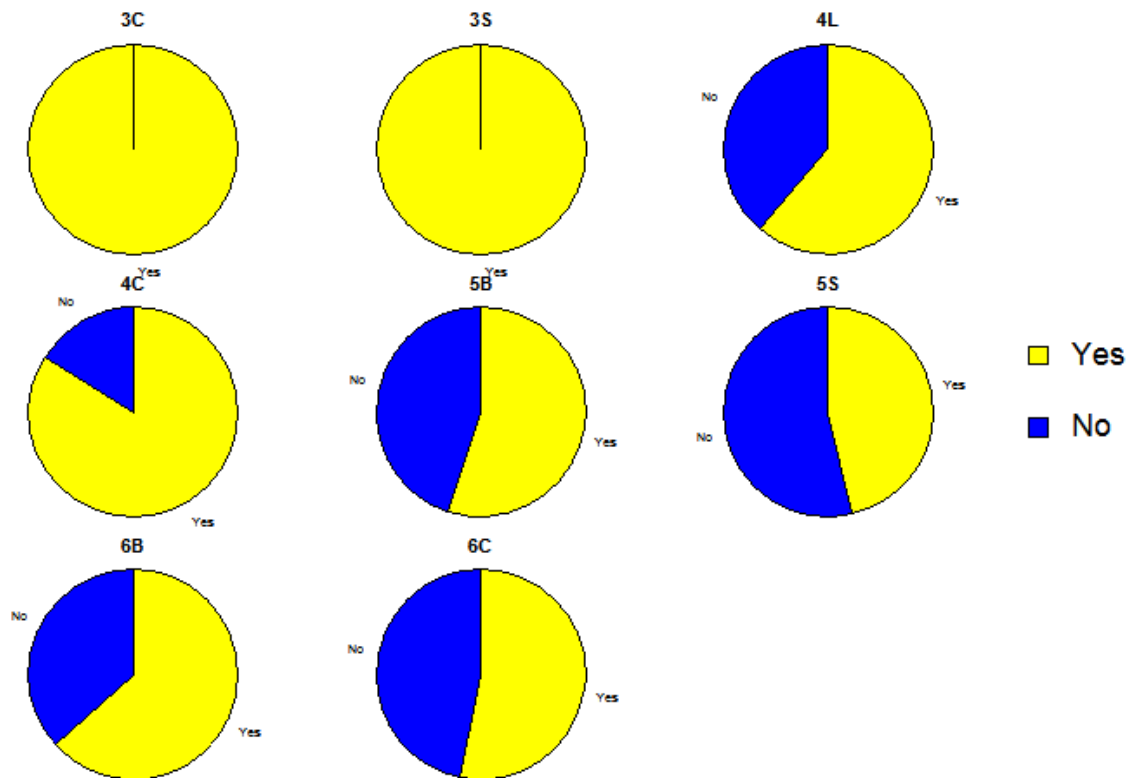
Have you represented Brockwell Junior School at competition level?



Action –Discussions were held with non-participants to identify why they had not been able to represent the school at competition level. The vast majority of the 'No' group said that they had no interest in sports clubs or entering competitive sport. Others reported that they liked coming to the clubs but not playing competitively. However, a significant number expressed a desire to play competitively, if more teams/clubs were available.

Target–Our aim is to find competitive events that would allow more children to take part in representing the school at competition level, such as cross country. We will endeavour, to try, where possible, to take more teams to each event - i.e football, where 60 children attended the club over the year but only 11 children were put into competition. Additionally, we aim to include Boccia to target the less active but still interested group of children.

Represented the School at Competition Level by Class

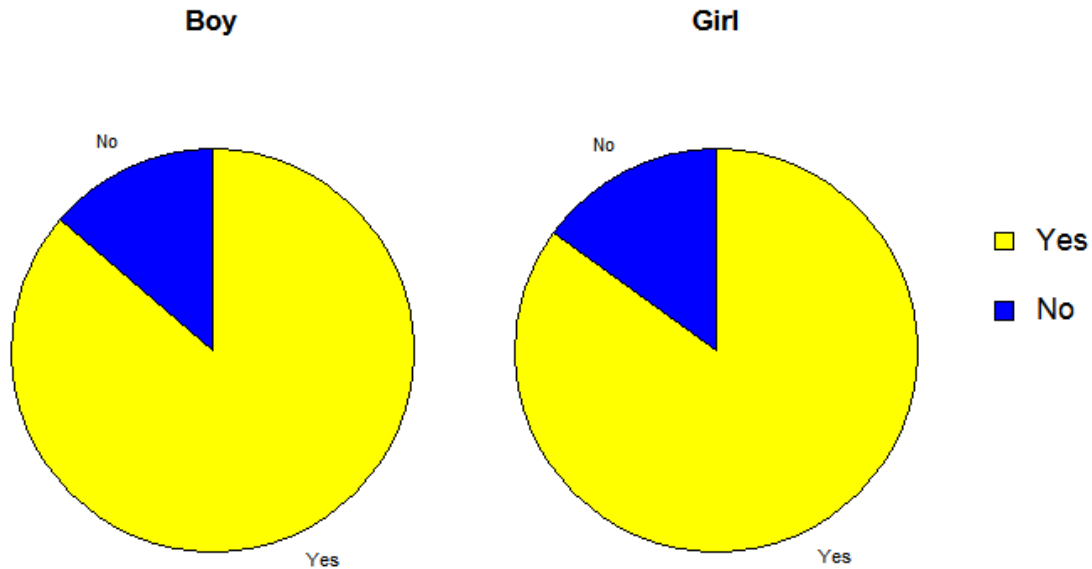


Findings – These charts show that in both Y3 classes, where they all attended the cross-country event, 100% of children felt that they had represented the school at competition level. All other year groups are showing that just over half of all children have represented the school at competition level.

Action - To look at extending large cross-country events to all year groups.

Target -It is our aim to achieve 100% participation at competition level in every class.

Have You Attended a Club - Gender

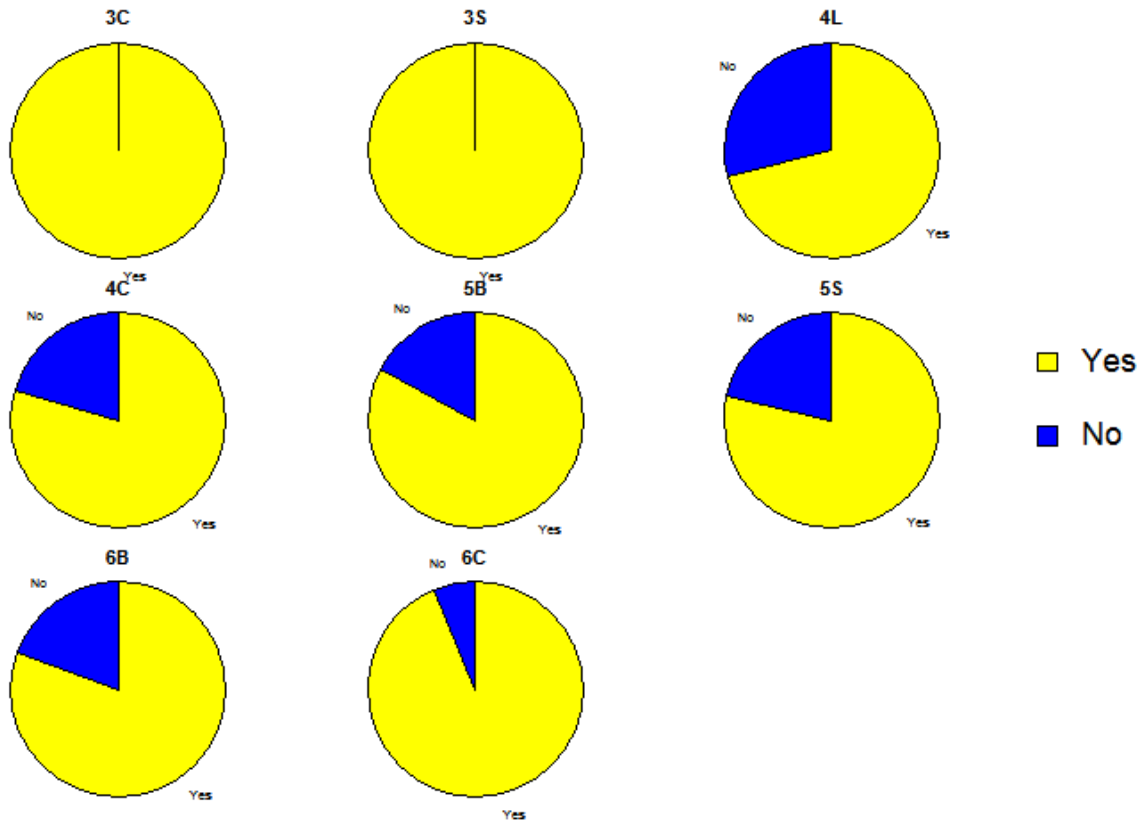


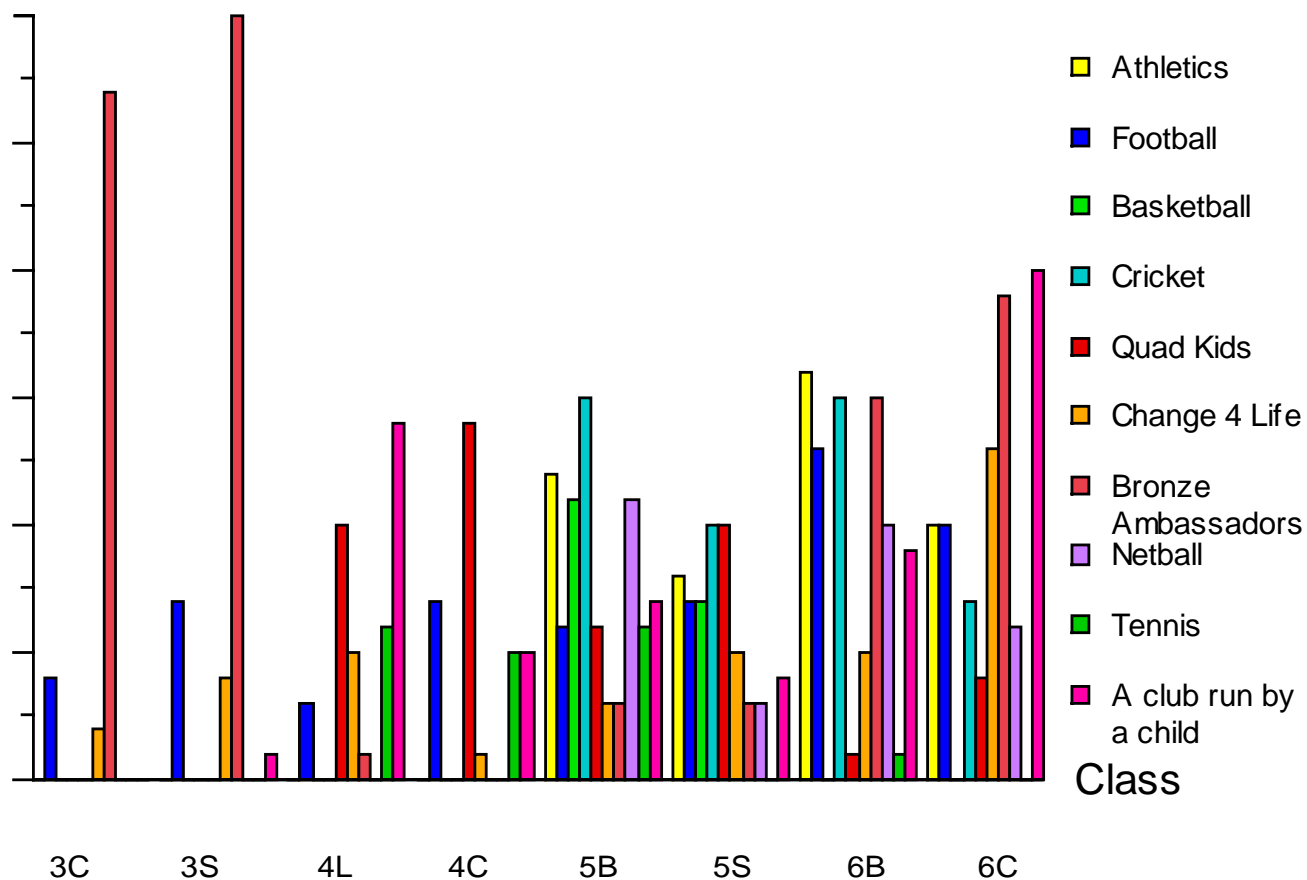
Findings - These graphs show that Brockwell has achieved a good balance of supporting and encouraging uptake of clubs for both boys and girls.

Action – None needed.

Target – To continue to provide and promote inclusive clubs for all.
Promote the football club for girls, with the aim of entering a girl's football team.

Attendance of Clubs by Class





Findings – these graphs show that over $\frac{3}{4}$ of most classes are attending extra-curricular clubs regularly. With Y5 and Y6 having a broad range of club participation. Class 4L, appear not to attend as many clubs run by other children or football club. It is also suggested, from the chart, that Y3 do not attend clubs run by adults but have attended the club run by the BYA.

Action – Discussed with Y3, which clubs they would like to take part in.

Target – To increase the number of Y3 children attending extra-curricular after school clubs.
