Last year Mrs Summerbridge introduced



We are delighted to introduce you to Advent of Change, a not-for-profit organisation that raises money and awareness for multiple charities. You may have seen their products over the last two years which have raised over £300,000 for charity. We have decided this year to buy Their Children's Advent Calendar which gives 50p a day to 24 charities. As the daily door is opened, you not only find out which amazing charity you have supported, but also what the donation means to that charity.

Alongside this calendar, AoC have developed a school programme which is freely available to anyone who has purchased the calendar. It contains modules, activities and information to run alongside the calendar and helps use the advent calendar in classrooms to talk to the children about charities, their work and about making the world a better and fairer place for everyone.

We will be using the resources to talk with the children about topics such as why charity is needed, the type of work they do across all sectors and why the values of kindness and respect are so important.
