- At our school, we respect all children and adults, and help to protect their rights.



How does Brockwell Junior School work to keep you safe?

- We provide a safe environment for you to learn
- Staff at our school know how to keep you and your friends safe, at home as well as school.
- It is important for you to know where to get help if you are worried or unhappy about something.
- We teach you how to keep you, and others, and to recognise risks in different situations. Our lessons include, healthy eating, e-safety, road safety, open water safety, personal safety, active consent and lots more too. Assemblies also are filled with lots of links to being aware of keeping yourself and others safe.

- Miss Holmes is our Safeguarding Lead and her main role is to keep our children safe.
- Mrs Crutchley and Mrs Graham are also part of the Safeguarding team.
